

Off The Wall Quilts

(1 day workshop)

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These are literally "off the wall" as I cover a painter's canvas that I purchase at Michael's or an art supply store with a small quilt design. The top of the box like structure is not only pieced but the sides are too. Then fabric is sewn to the back. They can be placed on a shelf or table or hung on a wall. I have been using my small "intuitive quilt designs" but you could use pieced or appliqué blocks as well. You can come to class with a pieced or appliqué top and work on the sides and assemble the piece or start from scratch with the piecing. Intuitive Color and Design book is recommended. You receive a 15% discount if you let Jean know ahead of time.

Supply List:

Lab fee for the 8" x 8" canvas \$12

Purchase a canvas that has been stretched over a frame. (I find mine at Michael's or Art Media in Portland.) I have been working with 8" x 8" or smaller.

Bring scraps of fabric in a palette you like to piece the sides, top and back, enough to cover the box like structure. You will need scraps of batting to fit all sides, top and bottom of the structure. (If you have some thicker batting bring an 8" square piece.) You will need a couple pieces of fabric that is 34" in length for the sides.

Bring basic sewing and cutting supplies and plenty of straight pins, hand sewing needle and matching thread to the main color of your fabric, sewing machine in good working order..
